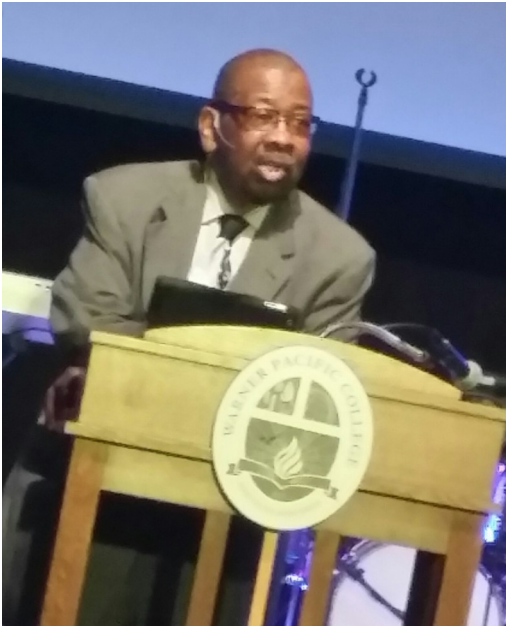

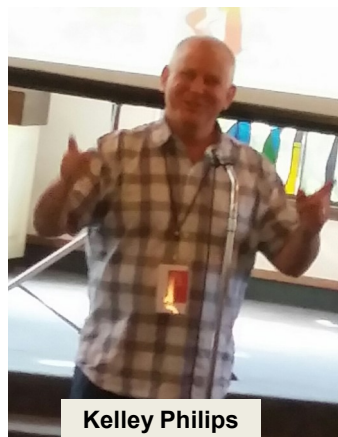

Annual Meeting: Budget Passed, Bylaws Approved, District Council Introduced

A new set of bylaws was approved July 29, during the 2015 Annual Business meeting of the Association of Churches of God in Oregon and SW Washington. Chairman Bob Haskell called the meeting to order and appointed tellers: Jack Hansen, Terry Shrout, Tim Townley, Linda Gerig, and Mary Hatch. Rev. David Shrout shared some devotional thoughts.

Held at the McGuire Auditorium of Warner Pacific College in Portland, the meeting was open to everyone, with 98 registered voters present, representing 45 pastors, 41 lay delegates and 12 commission members. Structured after a "governance model" the intent of the newly approved bylaws is to allow for freedom and accountability of leadership, while shifting from the General Council to a District Council comprised of appointed representatives from all eight regions.

Each Region has met at least once, and Rev. Shrout urged pastors to encourage their regional congregations to meet together.

The 2015-2016 Budget passed, 86-10, with discussion about Camp White Branch, the District transitional phase, progress toward a balanced budget and reduced spending of savings/reserves. Total projected funds of \$197,061.47 include a one-time line item from savings in the amount of \$27,961.47 during the transition, in order to meet the 2015-2016 Budget.

The new District Council will decide, in conjunction with Regions, which Commissions function as Task Forces and how funds will be allocated. Rev. Shrout presented certificates of appreciation to the Executive Council for their work during the transition phase.

Credentials and Advisory Board Chair, Monica Monroe, reports that the Board is currently working with 21 individuals in the credentialing process—some are district commissioned, and some are licensed.

The District presently has 161 approved ministers, for whom the CAB maintains files and performs annual registration. In compliance with recommendations in the most recent Credentials Manual of the Church of God, the CAB is working toward conducting a written review of every ordained minister on a five-year cycle. Churches currently open: St. Helens, Rainier, Redmond, Klamath Falls and Gales Creek, Oregon. ~kt

District Ministers meet for Business and Fellowship

Association ministers met Wednesday morning to conduct business, under the leadership of Chair Linda Tucker-Bays, and to verify and share information. An approved list of ministers and churches in Oregon and SW Washington was distributed by Credentials Chair, Monica Monroe. Rev. David Shrout provided updates from the ChoG Convention (formerly North American Convention), noting a decision for a two-year rotation (see related article on page10).



Rev. Shrout reported that the “Be Bold Academy” was launched during the June convention, with personal and church online accounts available for a monthly fee. Contact Church of God Ministries, 800-848-2464 or go to beboldacademy.org.

Rev. John Kuykendall shared information about Camp White Branch, noting the need for a point-person from each congregation as we work toward a three-year pledge program.

Rev. Don Minkler shared information about a proposed ministry: “School of the Called Seminary,” specifically geared toward Church of God doctrines, and covering methods, philosophy, and the call of God. Taught by Church of God pastors, the coursework is designed for 100-200 level classes under the direction of Association Senior Pastors (Resident Faculty), with 300 and up courses set by the Senior Faculty (Administrator and four senior pastors). General Assembly Makes Historic Convention Decision

For more than a century, the Church of God has convened almost every summer for worship, preaching, fellowship, and the General Assembly. In a historic vote, this year's General Assembly decided overwhelmingly to make a change to the frequency of the Church of God Convention. Signaling a new day for the Church of God, the resolution paves the way for maximum General Assembly and convention accessibility and engagement.

In 2014, the General Assembly elected a seven-member convention committee to determine location, dates, and the program for this year's convention. But that wasn't their entire responsibility—they were also chosen to "prepare a proposal for the long-term trajectory of the Convention (including its meeting cycle, timing, and location)."



After careful research, extensive review, and prayerful discussion, **the committee proposed that, going forward, the Church of God Convention and General Assembly would meet during odd-numbered years, while the International Youth Convention—our largest Church of God gathering— would meet during even-numbered years.** By affirming the resolution, the **General Assembly also demonstrated support for regional meetings to take place in the even-numbered years**, thereby encouraging broader participation and accessibility. These regional gatherings will take what you know and love about the Church of God Convention *on the road*. Coming to a city near you, you'll find the same high-quality worship, speaking, and conferences you've come to expect, but in a

condensed format to save you time and money. Furthermore, General Assembly 2015—with attendance higher than recent years—affirmed the need for intentional international participation every fourth year.

Thank you, Jennifer Carney, Tommy Dove, Milton Granum, Eric Livingston, Jim Lyon, Jesus Mena, Melissa Pratt, Michael Thigpen, and Judy Weeks for your dedication and service to the Church of God through the convention committee. We are indebted to your hard work and labor of love.

HYSLIP, Lewis Edward 11/12/1934-6/25/2015)

A Celebration of Life service will be held August 1st promptly at 10:57 a.m., in loving memory of **Rev. Lewis Edward (Eddie) Hyslip** at the Hoodview Church of God, 1530 Mt. Hood Avenue, Woodburn, OR 97071.

Born in Smithville, Arkansas to Louis N. and Susie F. (Henshaw)

Hyslip, Lewis was the youngest of seven children. His dad was a sharecropper which made for a challenging childhood. At the age of 18 Lewis joined the United States Navy where he served his country from 1952-1954 aboard the USS Mount McKinley.

He obtained a Bachelor's degree in Theology at Warner Pacific College (then Pacific Bible College) and went on to complete his Master's degree in Philosophy of Christian Education at Azusa Pacific University. He taught at Seattle Pacific University while undertaking Doctorate Studies in Christian Education at the University of Washington.

Lewis served his Lord and Savior Jesus Christ as a pastor in multiple locations throughout the United States and Canada. He was ordained in Nevada City, CA, in 1962, and his formal ministry roles included the following:

- Youth Minister and Senior Pastor, North Fair Oaks Community Church, Redwood City, CA.
- Senior Pastor, Community Church of God, Colorado Springs, CO
- Multiple Interim ministry positions within Southern CA.
- Minister of Christian Education, First Free Methodist Church, Seattle, WA.
- Senior Pastor, Mountain View Church of God, Baker OR
- Executive Secretary, Church of God – Western Canada.

Lewis touched many lives as a pastor, family member, and friend. He was a wise and faithful man, known for his kind and generous nature. He brought smiles to those around him with his boisterous spirit and great sense of humor. Lewis enjoyed working on "projects" from church committees to making toys for his grandchildren, his passion for perfection shown through.

Lewis was preceded in death by siblings Virginia, Virgil, Lottie and Lester. He is survived by siblings William and Betty, sister-in-law Alene, his loving wife of 58 years Barbara Livingston Hyslip, children Sonja, Tam-

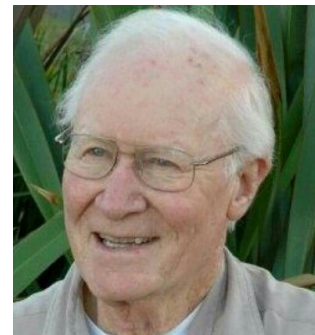

ROGERS, Ward Leslie (7/6/1933-7/27/2015)

Rev. Ward Rogers, Senior Adult Pastor at the Tigard Church of God passed away July 27, 2015. A Celebration of Life service will be held Friday, August 7, at 3:00 p.m., at the Tigard Church of God, 15670 SE 98th Avenue, Tigard, OR 97224.

Ward Leslie Rogers was born July 6, 1933, in Boise, Idaho, the fourth son of Claude Albert and Bessie Estella Rogers. Later, he had two younger sisters. Ward grew up on a farm in Notice, Idaho, and at ten years old his arm was injured in a hunting accident. In his sophomore year of high school he transferred to Caldwell High, where he met Mary Ann Meyer. They married on August 10, 1950. This month would have marked 65 years of marriage.

Ward finished his senior year through correspondence, and then worked at a local meat market as an apprentice meat cutter. He supported Mary and himself through those early years, during college, and his first two pastorates by cutting meat and managing meat markets. In 1953 Ward accepted a call into ministry and Mary and Ward packed up everything and headed to the International Bible College in San Antonio, Texas. Their first child, Lloyd, was born during their years at Bible school. After graduation the little family moved back to Caldwell, where, daughter Shirley was born.

Together with his mentor, Rev. John Hash, Ward planted the Church of the Open Door in Boise, ID, where John served as Senior Pastor and Ward served as the Minister of Christian Education. It was Pastor Hash who later encouraged Ward to accept a position with the Church of God. For over 55 years he served in COG congregations, including Middleton, ID, Pendleton and Reedsport, OR, Yakima and Spokane, WA, Camrose, Alberta Canada, San Bernardino, Santa Cruz and Whittier, CA. After (his first) retirement in 1994,

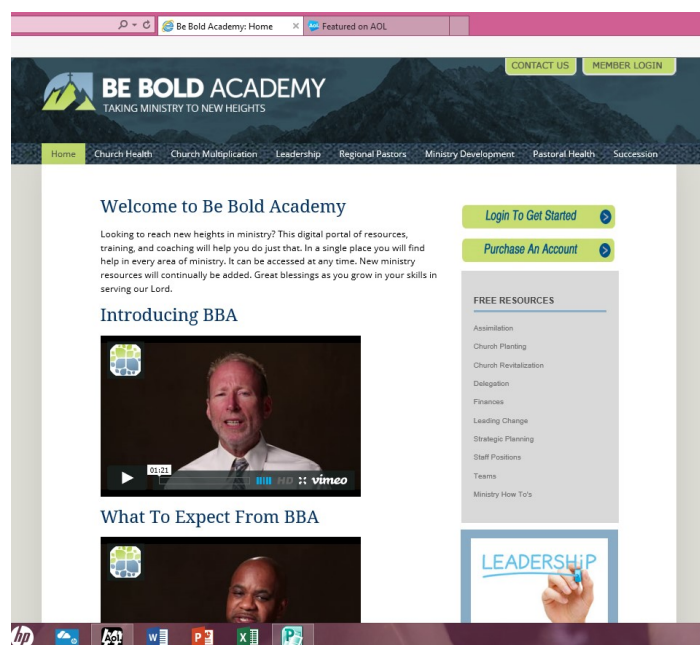
Ward continued to serve in various retirement homes, associate, interim and chaplain positions until 2006. While serving in Pomona, CA, he helped relocate the church, remodel their facility, and served as Senior Pastor until 2008. He served for a couple of years in Reedsport, and since 2010 has served in the Tigard, OR, congregation as Associate of Senior Adult Ministries and Visitation.

Ward was diagnosed on July 3, 2015 with stomach and Esophagus cancer. He faced his final days with courage, dignity and humor. He went home to be with the Lord July 27, about 9 a.m., surrounded by family. Ward ran the race set before him with perseverance, just as the author of Hebrews calls us to do.

Ward is survived by his two sisters, Carol Putnam and Kay Marrs and their families, his loving wife, Mary Ann, their two children, Lloyd Albert Rogers (Kerrie Sue Rogers) and Shirley Estella Culver (Roy Milton Culver Jr.), five grandchildren, nine great-grandchildren and numerous nieces and nephews.
