Tim and Joy Coppess are no strangers to the Church of God, having spent the bulk of their lives in Anderson, Indiana, not to mention that Joy is the daughter of retired Church of God executive Jim Williams. Both are graduates of Anderson University, then Anderson College. Both are passionate lifelong educators, Tim with more than twenty years as a high school science teacher and Joy as a preschool teacher. A few years ago, Tim and Joy began to sense a call to ministry, and Tim stepped down in faith from his teaching position to pursue ordination. For the past three years, Tim has served as pastor of University Park Church of God, Johnstown, Pennsylvania.

Gales Creek to install Tim Townley as Lead Pastor

Gales Creek Community Church of God extends an invitation to District congregations to attend the Installation Service of Pastor Tim Townley on Sunday, October 2, 2016, at 3 p.m.

Pastor Tim, 47, has served as interim pastor at the Gales Creek Church since January 24, 2016.

From Independence, Missouri, Townley moved to Oregon in 1994 after serving in the US Army as a Combat Medic and a Chemical, Biological, Radiological and Nuclear specialist. "God woke me up," says Townley, who adds that he got into some serious trouble before he became a Christian in November of 1995.

Since then, Townley attended Warner Pacific College, and volunteered with Teen Challenge, a non-profit substance abuse recovery ministry operating across the nation. Tim's volunteer work led to a full time staff position that started in May of this year. "I pastor in two different ways. In the trenches and in ministry," says Townley. He also served as an Associate Pastor at Holladay Park Church of God for four years.

Pastor Tim believes "God is leading Gales Creek to be a healing church. If you're broken, hurting, or wounded, you should be able to go without being judged, without ridicule. If someone walks through the doors and does not feel loved and welcomed, something's wrong." Townley says he has a heart for rural communities, having spent a lot of time in that setting in younger years.

"I want to see Gales Creek Church become a parish style church," says Townley. "It should be a hub, with the surrounding community the spokes of a wheel. People should be able to rely on the church to meet their needs. It doesn't matter if they're Christian or not."

The congregation meets at 9170 NW Sargent Rd, Gales Creek, OR 97117. They encourage, "Please join in worship and thanksgiving to the Lord as we celebrate His faithfulness and steadfast love."
