Greetings Friends!

Happy New Year to all! I trust and pray that you each had a great Advent and Christmas season and took the opportunity to rest and celebrate with family and friends. Many are breathing a sigh of relief that 2021 is now in our rearview mirror. However, with the uncertainty of what 2022 might bring, the relief is short lived. It is so important to stay connected to the Holy Spirit especially during times of discontinuous change. We are often tempted to run out ahead of God and try and fix the problems that exist or face challenges on our own. In his book, Joining God, Remaking Church, Changing the World: The New Shape of the Church in Our Time, Alan J. Roxburgh reflect on four ways the

people of God often try and repair our broken world and the church's waning influence in the affairs of our communities. The four fixes include:

- 1. Functional rationalism ("We have the technology; we can fix it.")
- 2. Management and control ("With the right management, we can guarantee success.")
- 3. Ecclesiocentrism ("If we can fix the church all will be well.")
- 4. Clericalism ("We are the ordained; we must have the answers.")

For further explanation I suggest you read the book. Roxburgh's conclusion is that none of these attempts to solve the problem of the past have worked. What is truly needed is an understanding that God is the primary mover, and that our job as Jesus followers is to listen to God and join God in what God is up to in our neighborhoods. Roxburgh states, "We are witnessing a great transformation. At the core of this change is the deep conviction that God is the primary actor who is out ahead of us in the neighborhood. The huge challenge for the Euro-tribal churches is how we come to release our techniques, management, and desire to fix the church, and instead believe it is God who is acting out ahead of us, particularly in our neighborhoods." God is present and at work in our communities. If we hope to make a difference for God's Kingdom, we must listen and watch for where God is at work and join in. That may sound easy, but it is not always intuitive. Seeing God at work requires us be able to recognize the still small voice of God. It also requires us to listen to our neighbors. Both actions take intentionality. I want to challenge us all to make a commitment this new year to spend time daily cultivating our listening ears. Listening to God through scripture, prayer and solitude and listening to our neighbors. Allow God to transform you and rest assure, what God does in you, God will do through you to help transform your community.

"We had such a fun and meaningful experience participating in the Live Nativity with our church family this year. Our three children, as well as Jon and I, played different

character roles during the two nights—younger & older Mary, Joseph, Jesus, and shepherds." Pastor Brian and Sheila Arnold gave oversight to the team this year.


PIE and PIR ... Rockwood COG



Greetings from Camp,

We are excited to let you know we have set the dates for our 2022 Church of God Summer Camps and registration will open in March. Danette Beisley, our Camp Coordinator, is busy working with the individual camp directors preparing for a great summer camp season. If you are interested in

We are also starting to look for seasonal staff (June 1- Sept 1) and volunteers to help this summer. We need a cook and a general staff member to help with cleaning, dishwashing, yard care, etc. More details will be posted on our website for these positions in January. We are hoping we will have volunteers again as assistant cooks and kitchen help, which is typically for 3-5 days at a time, with staff housing/meals provided. It looks like our reroofing project (dining hall, caretaker house, Fir cabin) will start in the spring since we have had quite a bit of snow at the camp. As mentioned last month, reroofing additional cabins will cost \$10,000 each and the office and assistant house will cost around \$20,000 to complete both from start to finish. New roofs are needed to mitigate damage to the buildings since some are starting to leak. Donations can be made by sending a check to the District Office or donating on our website. (Please note roofing project.) We are hoping for several work groups from churches to help this spring with the repairs needed on the buildings to be reroofed, the clean up needed when the old roofs are removed, and to help prep the camp for groups in the spring. We are actively pursuing candidates for the 'On-site Maintenance Specialist' and the 'Operations Manager' for the camp. We hope to hire in January or February so we can have staff trained for our peak summer season. Please continue to pray for our search for candidates and wisdom for the hiring committee.

We were blessed with a donation from a church to purchase all the items on our previous needs list. This was such a blessing!! We have a new needs list if you are interested in donating for a specific item. You can find details on our website.

Happy New Year—Reflections from Paula

Sitting at my dining room table this morning for my devotions reminded me of the many changes I have had in my life since returning to Oregon 3 1/2 years ago. I have been given opportunities to be interim pastor at the Newberg Church of God, have worked with Love Inc in Newberg with their transitional ministry to Women and for the last 17 months, I have had the joy of working with you—our district churches, pastors and church families. Each job has given me opportunity to learn new skills, draw close to God in the doing, and to learn patience in the waiting. It has reminded me that God enables those he calls and that he loves us even when we experience what we term as 'failure.'

Many of you know that my husband and I had opportunity to serve as a ministry team for 40 years. It is different serving as a single pastor, but, God always provides and often surprises me with exciting experiences in life and in ministry. At this time last year I was in transition with my housing and most of my belongings were still in storage in Madera, CA, where I had been on staff at the Fourth Street Church of God.

Several years ago I began looking for a home but the doors closed one after another. I thought I knew what I wanted—a single story family home with 3 bedrooms and 2 baths with some "old fashioned" charm. A place I could entertain friends and even house women working towards their own place. I needed a home I could afford and I was only looking in the Newberg area because that is where I believe God has planted me.

About this time last year, I received a call from a friend at church telling me of a condo that was for sale down the road from George Fox. My heart said no because it was in a 55+ community and I didn't want to admit I am getting older. It was in an HOA community and I knew there would be restrictions to live there. It was two stories and stairs have not always been my friend with 3 ankle surgeries under my belt. BUT, God was telling me to check it out. Three days later my offer was accepted for the purchase.

After a year of renovation, moving, and settling my "stuff", and recently saying yes to being on the HOA board, I can hardly believe I just celebrated Christmas in MY home. I have never purchased a home on my own. I am so thankful that God has brought me to a place where everyone I meet is friendly and willing to help when I need it. Many of my neighbors are Christians and I look forward to opportunities to meet others who need the love of the Lord imprinted on their lives (in a kind and gentle way).

I am so grateful that God knows what we need even when we don't. I am also grateful to be active in a church that is a loving presence in our community and for a job where I can serve and be served . . . because YOU are such a blessing to me.



I am thankful also for Jerry Davisson, our district pastor, who listens and follows what God is telling him. He has given me the opportunity to be a part of a discipleship experience (Gravity Leadership) that will always be a part of who I am and I gain new appreciation for him the longer we work together.

We all have experienced challenges in our lives. Mine are no different than many of yours. They may have different expressions but they have the same face. I believe that God loves US! He is present and working where WE are! He cares about the challenges WE face more than WE do and He meets US in our reality! I also know that what He is doing through US He is also doing in US!

Be encouraged because I know God is doing a new thing and wants us to be a part of where he is working. It's a new year and I'm excited to see what is next . . . are you with me?


