Greetings Friends!

Our team has been doing a lot of thinking about the challenges and opportunities we face as an Association. We have been framing it in the language of pioneers and settlers. In his insightful book, *Canoeing the Mountain*, Tod Bolsinger reminds us that in a world filled with rapid change and uncertainty, the metaphor of 'canoeing the mountains' beautifully captures the essence of adaptability and resilience required in leadership and life's journeys.

In the book, Bolsinger draws from the story of Lewis and Clark, explorers who embarked on a mission expecting rivers but encountered the unexpected challenge of mountains. Similarly, our churches are being presented with unforeseen obstacles requiring us to pivot, learn, and adapt.

Pioneering isn't just about being the first—it's about courageously embracing the unknown, challenging assumptions, and reimagining our strategies when confronted with unexpected landscapes. The terrain we navigate might not match what we've prepared for, but it's in these moments of uncharted territories that our true leadership shines.

As we paddle through these unanticipated 'mountains'—whether they be technological advancements, shifting societal paradigms, or personal challenges—let us remember three crucial lessons from Bolsinger's insights:

- 1. **Adaptability**: The ability to pivot and adapt plans in the face of unexpected circumstances is essential. Instead of clinging to familiar ways, true pioneers learn to embrace change and innovate accordingly.
- 2. **Humility**: Just as Lewis and Clark had to seek guidance from indigenous people in their expedition, true leadership involves humility in acknowledging that we don't have all the answers. Seeking wisdom from diverse perspectives fosters growth and understanding in uncharted territories.
- 3. **Resilience**: Pioneering demands resilience—the willingness to persist even when the path seems insurmountable. Challenges are opportunities for growth, and perseverance in the face of adversity often leads to unexpected discoveries and successes.

Lents-Gilbert Shares ...

What an eventful and inspiring journey 2023 has been for the Lents-Gilbert Church of God! The year unfolded with an abundance of blessings, culminating in a heartwarming Carol Sing-A-Long that not only celebrated the joy of the season but also delved into the profound history of cherished hymns such as "I Heard the Bells on Christmas Day."

In exploring the origins of this timeless hymn, we uncovered the poignant story of Henry Wadsworth Longfellow, the renowned writer and poet. In the midst of the Civil War in 1863, Longfellow penned the poem "Christmas Bells" on Christmas Day. Bereaved and grappling with personal tragedy, having lost his wife, Fanny, two years prior to a tragic accident, and dealing with the news of his son Charlie being wounded in the war, Longfellow found solace in expressing the complex emotions of his own heart and the turbulent world around him.
