Greetings Friends!

I have just returned from the biannual Church of God Convention and General Assembly held in Tampa FL. Thank you for allowing me to attend and to represent our Association at this important meeting. It was great to see old friends and to make new ones. The main sessions and electives were inspiring and filled with excellent content. The General Assembly, which is made up of credentialed ministers and lay delegates from Church of God congregations in the United States and Canada was held 3 days during the conference. Each session lasted for two and a half hours. The GA is where decisions are made on behalf of the

movement since its first meeting in 1917. According to Loyd Moritz in his most recent ChoGBlog, "there were at most approximately 500 registered delegates in person, and a measly 120 watching online. On the final day, Saturday, where some of the most significant votes were held those numbers were closer to 400 and 95, respectively. At best, less than 7% of eligible voters participated in the important decisions that were made." As you can see, broad-based participation in the G.A. seems to be waning. Many factors contribute to these low numbers including location and cost of travel. Even so, some important topics were discussed, and decisions made.

As many of you have heard, our General Director Jim Lyon's term of service is up in 2025. Jim has made the decision not to be considered for another term. At the GA there was information given on the search process that has begun. Information on how we can pray and participate will be communicated through the usual channels used by Church of God Ministries. You can also find information on the national website at jesusisthesubject.org in the "about" tab. Jim Lyon gave a report that highlighted some of the challenges of his position and the difficulties for the movement moving forward. He talked about the need for "real dialogue" regarding a change in the way the Church of God operates if we are to see any growth in the future.

One of the areas of growth that the assembly saw as important is in the area of racial and gender equity. At the 2021 GA in Denver, CO a resolution was passed to establish a Justice and Equity Task Force dubbed the Jet.Force. The purpose of the Jet. Force was "to discover the composition, beliefs, and



practices of Church of God agencies and congregations with regard to racial justice and the equality of men and women across the Movement in the United States and Canada and to ascertain the impact of such composition, beliefs, and practice on the global mission of the Church of God." The task force did an excellent job of surveying the church and reporting its findings. An 86-page booklet was distributed to the delegates highlighting some of the history of the movement regarding equity and women in ministry. From their research, the Jet. Force proposed several recommendations for the Church of God movement including celebrating our diversity and women in ministry, communicating our commitment to these important issues, creating resources as well as opening opportunities for dialogue, and coaching leaders. They also presented six new resolutions including the hiring of a new executive leadership position called the Director of Strategic Partnership as well as directing Church of God ministries to coordinate a celebration of diversity on Pentecost Sunday. There was also a resolution directing Church of God ministries to coordinate a celebration of women in ministry called PreacHer Sunday. A Sunday in March set aside to promote women in ministry with the goal of filling as many pulpits in the movement with women as possible. I applaud the work done by the Jet force and hope this spurs the movement on to greater ethnic and gender equity and inclusion.

Among some of the other resolutions that were presented to the GA was the approval of the budget, consideration of where the convention is held, as well as a resolution to give seminary graduates an exemption from or fast tract to completing the Leadership Focus credentialing track.

While at the conference I had the opportunity to participate in the Global Strategy 5k fun run to benefit disaster relief around the globe. "Fun run" is relative as Saturday morning brought 80+ degree heat with high humidity.

I left the convention with mixed emotions. I was inspired by the content of the meeting but feeling like the movement needs some drastic changes if we are to thrive in the future. I have hope that if we keep Jesus as not only the subject but the object of our discipleship and attention, we can make an impact not only in the United States and Canada but around the globe. In a world full of division, the world still needs the call to unity that the Church of God has always embraced—a call to Holy Spirit led unity not uniformity.

Seabird Chapel Church of God (Bandon)

It has been an exciting couple of months for Seabird Chapel, Church of God in Bandon.

God has been stirring mightily in a few churches within this tiny coastal town, and the result has been a refreshing season of *joint* ministry among fellow believers from different congregations/denominations.

For the last several years, Seabird Chapel has joined with two other local churches (Faith Baptist and Pacific Community Church) once a month for a joint prayer meeting. This has laid the groundwork for

a deep and shared bond between fellow believers. Early this year we saw direct fruit of this movement of God's Spirit as these three churches came together to plan a series of evangelistic outreaches in our community. Former NBA player and world evangelist, Bay Forrest, was asked to come and hold multiple rallies over the course of 2 weeks in April. In preparation for these events,





these three congregations committed to a 40-day period of prayer and fasting, which would end on the day of the first rally. To accompany this prayer and fasting, a booklet was put together with daily devotional passages, prayer lists, and other guides and study helps.

At the same time, a man from a different congregation (not among those 3 churches) felt God lay upon *his* heart to call all Christ followers in Bandon to consider a town-wide seeking of the Lord, including fasting, for the entire month of March. The Holy Spirit was stirring up believers all over this town simultaneously for the same purpose!

Praise God, through the Spirit's leading in these endeavors, we have seen many people come to Christ, entire families make a decision to start coming to church, an explosion in our youth ministry, and a spawning of additional joint-ministry outreach to our community! We saw a packed Bandon High

School gym filled with junior high and high school students for a youth rally, where the gospel message was delivered and about two dozen kids came to Christ on that night alone. I was told that one of the youth in attendance (a pastor's kid from a different church) confessed that she was not right with God and yielded everything to Him that night!

This youth rally drew in an additional *two* other congregations to join with our three churches and pour into this exciting work! Now 5 churches were serving together! There was also a weekend men's rally, and a weekend women's rally, which greatly strengthened our congregations. For two Sundays in a row, we cancelled our normal Sunday morning worship services and combined with two other churches in one building to honor God. There were two people at those joint worship services who felt the call to be baptized right then and there!

In the 22 years I've served in Bandon, I have never witnessed God bringing His people together for one purpose like this! This is what the Church of God movement proclaimed at the beginning of its formation—that there is <u>one God</u> and <u>one church</u> and <u>one common, shared</u> experience for all of God's children!





The local church is the main way Jesus chose to bring hope and love to the world. By "church" we don't mean denominations, buildings, organizations, sacraments or creeds. We believe the church is at its most profound and basic when it acts as an extension of Jesus' command to love God and love others.

People getting together to love Jesus, each other and the world is what the church looks like when it is stripped back to its essential core. Or, as Jesus put it, "when two or three are gathered in my name, there I am in the midst of them."

Megachurches are great! Not only do we have nothing against them, we believe the world needs more of them.

House Churches are great too! No one knows how many of them exist all over the world but, especially where the church is illegal, they are a vital spiritual lifeline for untold millions of believers. They deserve and need our prayer and support.

So, if megachurches and house churches are so wonderful, why is New Small Church all about the churches in between and what do we mean by "Small Church?"

Numerically, the boundaries between churches of each size are fairly fluid, but here's a guide:

House Church: Less than 25 (and meeting in a house), **Small Church:** 25 - 350 (or under 25 meeting in a church building), **Big Church:** 350 - 2,000, **Megachurch:** Over 2,000

Helping Small Churches Thrive

WHY WE EXIST

Small Churches don't appeal to everyone. But, as it turns out, they do appeal to most people. More followers of Jesus have attended Small Churches in the last 2,000 years than any other type of church. That doesn't mean they're the best way to do church (we believe the "best" way is whatever works for the people who need it), but as the most popular type of church in existence, they need to receive more attention, support and encouragement than they typically have.

Small Churches make up 80% - 90% of the known churches in the world, but are the subject of probably less than 1% of the books and blogs about how to do church ministry. Small Churches are no better and no worse than churches of any other size. But they have been the most neglected, especially when it comes to pastoral training.

New Small Church wants to help fill that gap. We exist to encourage, connect and equip innovative Small church leaders. That's not just a slogan – it's what we actually plan to do. We want to see better, stronger, healthier Small Churches, led by passionate, prayerful, capable, innovative and loving pastors.

We believe being small is not a problem to fix, but a strategy God wants to use.

Most Small Church leaders have not been told that – or at least they haven't been told it enough. If we can help turn up the volume on that message, we will have done what we set out to do.

The Awakening ...



I didn't grow up in the Church of God. I didn't go to Warner Pacific or Anderson University. But, I came into contact with the Church of God of Exeter congregation as a kid and was loved on by a sweet church family of mothers, fathers, and grandparents. Years later, that same church invited me to be Youth Pastor, then Discipleship Pastor, and finally Lead Pastor. Those 14 years of ministry are a fond season of life for my family. For sure, there were challenges and difficulties, but by and large, the experience was incredibly fruitful and life-changing. The reason: I came into intimate contact with a rugged group of people who still call themselves a Movement, who dream of a united church, who desire for the church to live holy lives unto the Lord—filled and empowered by the Spirit of God, who take the hand of every blood-washed one, and who have no creed but the Bible. I have come to love the Church of God and believe our Movement is uniquely positioned like no other denomination, organization, or group to live into the ideals it holds. I think the world needs the witness of the Church of God today. We are a united church for a divided world. For that reason, I developed the Awakening Series as one of my ministry priorities as the new Multimedia & Resource Pastor for the Association.

The Awakening is a series of conversations with leaders from inside and outside of the Movement that are meant to infuse voices, resources, and inspiration for today's challenges. As this article is written there are currently six episodes published on YouTube for viewing, sharing, and discussing.

Episode 1, "A Movement Captivated by Idealism" is a conversation with Dr. Barry Callen, the Movements most prolific writer. He and I discuss some new resources he has recently published, and as always with Dr. Callen, we discuss the beauty and the agony of the Church of God.

Episode 2, "The Five Non-Negotiables" is a discussion with Dr. Jim Lyon, Executive Director of Church of God Ministries. Jim shares the back story of the five non-negotiables and their importance in his story and our story. They capture well the unique nature of the Church of God and deserve to be built upon for the next decades.

Episode 3, "Taking Back What Hell Has Stolen" is a second discussion with Dr. Jim Lyon. In this episode, we talk about the aggressive language Jim used for a previous ChoG Convention. Jim provides the back story and narrative scriptural background but also addresses some areas of pushback to the language.

A Series of Conversation

Episode 4, "Embracing the Ways of Jesus" is a lengthy talk with my friend and mentor, Bob Rognlien, Director of 3DM West and Founder of The Footsteps of Jesus and The Footsteps of Paul— immersive, experiential, guided trips to the Holy Lands. We discuss the way of Jesus and how it is such a helpful outline for the life and the ministry in which we find ourselves in this post-Christian, post-pandemic, secular era.



Episode 5, "BibleProject for the

Church of God" is a dialogue with Mike McDonald, Chief Strategic Relations Officer for the BibleProject. We explore the full variety of free resources the BibleProject has available, hear Mike's testimony and amazing strategy for engaging with change, and hear an open invitation for our Association and churches to partner with the BibleProject to see our people experience the Bible as a unified story that leads to Jesus.

In Episode 6, "The Rooted Impact of Women in Ministry" I sit down with the Reverend Dr. Kimberly Majeski, Executive Director of Christian Women Connection. We discuss Kimberly's ministry history and influences and hear about some of the new initiatives at CWC. We also discuss the impact of women in ministry in the Movement's early days, but the decrease in the number of women in ministry in our current day. You will hear about many open doors currently available to see more sisters leading Kingdom work in the present and future.



The Awakening Series is
