

Work Camps Advance Progress on Multipurpose Facility

A productive work-camp weekend at the end of May, saw church families working together from Rainier, St. Helens, and Woodburn congregations. They cleaned up the camp from one end to the other, split and hauled firewood, repaired piping, made great progress on the wood shed, firewall sheetrock, and inside walls in the bathroom and nurse's area. They even cleaned and filled the swimming pool. The inspector approved the first layer of sheetrock on the firewall May 31, with a follow-up inspection due when the second layer is completed.

Work continued on the firewalls in early June, with additional progress in preparation for the electrician to complete rough wiring.

By June 20⁻ a third "church work weekend" concluded. Add Reedsport and Albany Churches of God to the list of congregations who have pitched in to make great strides toward the goal.





"These five churches have really helped the camp," reports Mel Neu. "There is no way that we could ever accomplish all that they have done. Reedsport Church fixed Birch and Cedar cabins and helped with the building. Albany Church helped Leonard build and install the bridge over White Branch Creek, finished the second layer on the firewall, chopped and hauled many cords of firewood, and many other miscellaneous projects. We really do appreciate all of their work. It would be







impossible for the camp staff to accomplish all that was done." Mel adds, "This is the time to remind those who have pledges out to consider making them up to date. My prayer is that as we proceed enough money will come in to finish our goal." -kt
