I grew up in a typical large Catholic family. My parents made sure we were in church when we were supposed to be and received a good Catholic education, while my wife was raised in the Church of God. The priests and nuns, God bless them all, instilled in us a solid foundation of how to be not only a good Catholic, but a good Christian. My wife, as well, also received a solid foundation of faith through the Church of God.

You might say that I probably know my way around the kitchen. Probably. No doubt I got this gene from

my father who would spend a lot of time in the kitchen when I was growing up on his days off. I'll never forget the donuts he concocted. He made the dough, cut the donut shapes out and then deep fried and tossed them in cinnamon and sugar. He either didn't know or forgot the step of proofing (raising the donuts in a warm place) before deep frying them. Anyway, they were really, really chewy but tasted pretty good. Cinnamon and sugar make everything taste better, right?

Unlike my father, I was fortunate enough to have some formal training when I discovered that being a Forest Ranger was not going to happen. Something

to do with all the math and science I think. Now, even though I have not made my living in the industry for over a quarter century, I've been very blessed in being able to utilize many of the skills that I learned in school, doing things at church and at home. Occasionally I will make my latest fascination, as in cheesecakes or Bundt cakes, to work for a potluck or just because. There have been a few successes along the way, with a few failures sprinkled in. Two things I do to relieve stress are to work out and to cook.

My mother didn't like to cook as much as my father, but to this day, I still cook a couple of her creations, one of which is scrambled eggs. Now, you would think that this is about the easiest thing in the world to make. Not really, if you want to do them well. She would make these in a cast iron skillet in the days before Teflon was invented. The black cast iron skillet was a standard cooking appliance in those days. The eggs were so fluffy and not scorched at all. Just really nice.

This is one of her dishes that I took with me when I married this pretty gal from our church 36 years ago. One of my greatest joys in life is cooking for others, especially my family, and especially that pretty gal. I tweaked mom's recipe a little. It's a little like Julia Child's recipe but cooked just a tiny bit longer. If you top these with a little Tillamook cheddar, well you've hit the jack pot. If you were to ask Valerie, I would dare say that my scrambled eggs are one of her favorite dishes that I make for her.

Though I no longer attend the church of my youth, I am eternally grateful and appreciative to my parents and all of those who had a hand in laying that solid foundation of faith in my life. And man, those scrambled eggs of my mom's were good. Thanks Mom!
