Summer Celebration: 121st Campmeeting

A July 1944 article from the Woodburn Independent records Church of God Campmeetings as estimated at half a century old. That was 70 years ago. Transitioning from Campmeet-

ing to Summer Celebration, the July 2014 event convened at the Warner Pacific College Campus July 20-23—tagged the 121st annual gathering.

The three-day celebration was packed with music, prayer, fellowship, snacks, and great speakers with good, challenging messages to the Church. Attendance was good, and once again the youth made their presence known, sitting together during evening services in a reserved section of McGuire.

Pastor Ken and Keli Oldham shared of life in Egypt, and spoke of loving the Church by exalting Jesus. Mt. Scott's Youth Pastor Aaron Walton emphasized hope—"stronger, always and more". Ben Sand, whose passion is outreach, spoke of looking for Jesus in our communities, where least expected; and Jenny Marble, scooter-free, used a bag of colorful gummy bear candies


Bruce Steffensen and his wife Debi were honored for their service to the Association, with a special reception following Wednesday evening's worship service.
