# **Change the World**

Jesus believed his disciples could change the world. We believe that too.

Have you ever observed a problem in the world and wondered why God hasn't done something about it? If there were one thing you could do to change the world, what would it be? How would you be a part of the solution?

The **Change the World Initiative** is designed to empower individuals and/or groups, within the Church of God, to launch new ideas that demonstrate the transformative power of Jesus, while directly impacting neighborhoods, cities and the world. We acknowledge that the Holy Spirit is constantly moving to redeem, reclaim, and restore what hell has stolen. In the midst of a turning point in the Church of God, it is critical that the people of the church pray, discern, and act upon what God is prompting in each corner of the Movement.

Church of God Ministries will award Change the World grants and provide various forms support to empower the people of the Movement to initiate specific visions that change the world.

Proposals may include a request for funds up to \$20,000.

Since entering the post of General Director in August 2013, Jim Lyon was given the mandate to facilitate substantive, sweeping, change across the Church of God Movement.

Several things are clear: (1) the Church of God cannot stay the present course (to do so will only facilitate decline), (2) change, consequently, must come; (3) change is difficult, even when welcome.

In April 2014, Church of God Ministries gathered a group of diverse, experienced, well-respected leaders—committed to innovation and change—to ask them to help inspire innovation in the Movement. Hence, the emergence of the Change the World Grant Initiative and the leadership of the Innovation Trustees.

The **Innovation Trustees** will function in two key areas over the course of their assignment:

Change the World Grant Evaluation: The Innovation Trustees will review all submitted proposals and select proposals to be awarded and announced in January 2015

> • Team of Advisors for General Director: For one year's time, the Innovation Trustees will serve as a team of advisors designed to provide the General Director, and his Executive Team, a

strategic feedback loop as Church of God Ministries works to inspire dramatic change in the Movement.

The Church of God is filled with men and women young and old—who are passionate about serving their community in the name of Jesus. Change the World has been launched to encourage brothers and sisters to take risks and be bold to launch new programs in communities across North America. Whether it is serving at-risk youth, families in need, or the elderly, we want to provide targeted funding to help get your idea off the ground!

All applications will be evaluated based upon the following selection criteria:

- 1. **Specific Need Being Addressed**: What specific need(s) will this idea seek to address? All ideas should articulate how targeted support will provide opportunity for your idea to come to life.
- 2. Engaging the World in the Name of Jesus: How does this idea both transform the community and embody the presence of Christ in the world? How do you envision people experiencing the love of Christ, as a result of this idea, in word and deed, action and articulation, presence and proclamation?
- 3. *Mobilizing People:* What opportunities does your idea provide for followers of Jesus to put their faith into action? What opportunities does your idea provide for community members to love their neighbors?
- 4. *Growth Plan:* What type of team is needed for your idea to work well? What is the timeline for growth? What does success look like?


I will share more on this subject next time. Keep praising God in the good times and the bad times. "See" you next time.




